The Mission and Aims of EAIR

Preamble: EAIR is a European society whose interests encompass higher education and a wide international perspective.

The Mission of EAIR

The *mission* of EAIR is to support research and development in higher education research, policy and practice, to the general benefit of higher education.

The Aims of EAIR

The following aims should be read with reference to institutional, national and international contexts, as appropriate.

- To encourage research in higher education;
- To promote the development of institutional management, planning and policy implementation;
- To disseminate information that supports policy-making, policy implementation and good practice in higher education;
- To support the membership by providing opportunities for networking and professional development in the field of higher education.

EAIR seeks to achieve its aims by:

- Organising an annual Forum bringing together students, researchers, policy makers, leaders, administrators and practitioners;
- Publishing the peer-reviewed journal 'Tertiary Education and Management' which may include high quality papers from the annual Forum and other appropriate contributions. EAIR may support other publications too in addition to TEAM;
- Organising seminars and networking opportunities of interest to specific groups of the EAIR membership, involving non-members where appropriate. These may involve cooperation with other organisations:
- Providing a variety of opportunities for networking and professional development of members and other interested parties in the various fields of higher education:
- Initiating, encouraging and actively supporting comparative research on issues in higher education;
- Cooperating and exchanging information with relevant organisations;
- Providing other services to the membership, such as a membership directory; online databases; and electronic copies of Forum presentations;



Report by the Chair and the Secretary of EAIR

Since the foundation of EAIR, the last 12 months have probably been the most eventful in the history of our organisation. The move of the Secretariat to Leiden University has proved to be the right solution from many points of view. In particular, we can once again count on the direct support of a university in the "old tradition" in our more than 40-year EAIR history. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Leiden University in particular for the warm welcome and for providing the infrastructure for our Secretariat. After the Universities of Twente and Amsterdam, we can now look positively into the future, thanks to the formal support of a renowned university.

Nevertheless, EAIR was particularly challenged this year. Like so many other conferences, we had to cancel our Forum in 2020 in Ireland due to COVID-19. The preparations for the meeting were in full swing. We had reviewed over 152 submissions for the 9 tracks and had just selected the papers as more and more universities closed their doors, their campuses and their face to face study modes. Therefore, in close consultation with our 2020 host, the University College Cork (UCC) and the Executive Committee, our Forum was cancelled with a heavy heart. This is the first time in the history of EAIR that a planned Forum could not take place. This is bitter for our community and for all those who have been instrumental in the planning and development of this Forum. Therefore, I would like to thank especially the colleagues, Jennifer Murphy and Elizabeth Noonan, from the UCC for their work and great preparation. Of course, we hope that we will have the opportunity to hold our Forum at the UCC in the future!

Covid-19 has hit the whole university system globally as well as EAIR particularity hard. We were forced to reduce the capacity of the Secretariat before and during the pandemic. However, we were able to take care of the daily business and to implement important planning steps for the coming years. Without the commitment and flexibility of the Secretariat, the pandemic would certainly have threatened us more and caused more damage. With Dr. Isabel Roessler, Laura Lüchtefeld and Daniella Michiels van Kessenich-Zanda, the team was not only able to improve the work of the Secretariat last year, but also made it more effective and efficient by restructuring it. This was a prerequisite in order to master the challenges of the recent past.

Even though the Forum at the University of Leiden entitled "Responsibility of Higher Education Systems: What? Why? How?" with 305 participants and 92 contributions was a very successful event, it is all the more important that future events can follow. The accepted contributions for the Forum 2020 will be presented and discussed in a series of smaller webinars and virtual events over the upcoming months. Thus, we hope that exchange and discourse will not be neglected in 2020. By saying this, we made a great effort regarding the planning of our Forum for 2021. We are convinced that next year (September 9 to 11, 2021) we will meet personally at the Humboldt University of Berlin at the 42nd EAIR Forum!

Report on the EAIR Finances 2019-2020

We would like to thank our colleagues of the Audit Committee (Nynke Jo Smit and Joke Hageman) for their contribution.

Report on the EAIR Finances 2019

Realisation 2019

In 2019 the foreseen negative result of € 28.306 became a deficit of €75.459: a negative difference of: €47.153. This is mainly due to the following reasons:

The result of our expenditure is in total € 28.600 less costs than budgeted. This is not only the result of our strict policy to reduce the costs as much as possible, but especially because we had to cut in our costs in a rigorously way during the year.

Regarding Personnel: Lina Suratin resigned voluntarily (from March 2019 on) and to reduce costs, we decided not to fill her vacancy. The agreement with Gerlof was cancelled with effect from June 2019. According to Dutch Law we had to make a settlement agreement to terminate the employment contract by mutual consent and pay him the sum of €19.000. We have been able to save on extra personnel costs, because of a further limitation of the secretariat.

Regarding Related Personnel: because we moved the secretariat to Leiden, it resulted in a relative higher travel allowance for Lina and Gerlof (until June). The total of related personnel is higher as foreseen because of an administrative change in the accounting (the ponsion costs of the employees are shown on a more transparant manner in this overview). Regarding housing and secretariat costs there are no significant differences compared to the budget.

Regarding the forum costs and team costs:

The result of the Leiden forum is positive. We budgeted it for €113.758 and succeeded to reduce to costs to €98.018. The Forum Fees were €130.775, which means a positive result of €32.750. The TEAM publication costs are much higher than foreseen because of a post calculation (€6.494) of the publisher which was not included in the budget for this year.

In total € 77.573 less income than budgeted. There are two main reasons for this difference, namely: (1) a number of members who didn't continued their membership and/or refused to pay their membership (despite many reminders and mail and phone traffic) (total €16.694), and (2) a number of participants for the forum had signed up, but did not appear on the forum and refused to pay the fee (€23.216).

All in all, the difference of €75.459 between the budget 2019 and the consolidated and realized budget 2019 can be explained by the following main differences:

EAIR Budget 2019 to 2020

This financial situation is alarming and it seems that we don't succeed in getting our financial situation under control. We have a negative equity. The executive steering committee decided to take stronger actions in order to reduce the costs significant. Starting from February 2020 we stopped all cost-bearing activities and systems (insurances, management information system, computer maintenance and contracts (XS4All, Ziggo, Exact), so that we have virtually no longer fixed material loads. Also we decided to bring the secretariat to the absolute minimum, which means that Isabel and Daniella has stopped working for the EAIR. It is important to avert a bankruptcy, so therefore we must take these actions.

The executive board attempts to reverse this negative multi-annual trend and realizes that ferm decisions are still needed. Not only changes into the organizational structure of EAIR are needed, but also in it's activities. In the coming month's of 2020 the executive board will form a task force in order to formulate a clear and stable policy.



Nicoline Frølich and Kurt De Wit, Editors – Tertiary Education & Management

TEAM continues to have a good turnover of articles and is published timely four times a year. Points of attention are the quality of the submissions and the availability of (a broad spectrum of) reviewers.

Nicoline Frølich and Kurt De Wit took over from Malcolm Tight as editors-in-chief. The scope of the journal was somewhat broadened to include management, governance and organisation of higher education; teaching and learning in higher education; the academic profession and academic careers; higher education and the labour market; and institutional research in higher education. The attention for the (selective) publication of special issues was continued.

The move to Springer as publisher and the change of editors has taken TEAM through a transition period. This transition is still ongoing but should in time lead to a stronger influx of manuscripts and special issues.
